About this workshop

The Grant Enhancement Training (GET) Workshop is conducted twice a year by the clinical, epidemiological and statistical scientists of SCRI. This two-day workshop aims to help individuals develop competitive grant applications by facilitating early engagement and collaboration between investigators and experts in study design and quantitative methods, and by providing hands-on guidance in the preparation of a grant. The workshop will detail how best to present the key elements of the grant. A key component of the workshop is the dedicated review and discussion of each participant's proposal. After the workshop, participants would be better equipped to write a persuasive, high impact research proposal for the next grant call.

Target Audience

Principal Investigators and their collaborators (if any) who:

- Are interested in improving their grant application
- Open to new ideas and suggestions on improving their research proposals
- Have a draft research proposal ready (at least 4 pages) on a clinical/translational research topic (i.e. involving human volunteers)
- Will submit grant applications to NMRC in 2012.
